The Power of Peace

27Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid.

John 14:27

Recently, in worship, we had a passage from Deuteronomy that offered the promise that those who followed the law of God would be blessed, and someone asked “isn’t that the ‘prosperity gospel’? I thought that wasn’t right.” The interesting problem, with thinking that God promises that obedience will bring “prosperity”, isn’t in the promise. God’s promise is that following the principles of the law is like paying attention to the owner’s manual of our lives. We are less likely to do things that bring negative consequences. The real problem, however, isn’t the promise, it is our understanding of “prosperity.” The promise is of peace, and that is the detail that has real value.

When I started in parish ministry, I began in Orange, California, one of the wealthier communities in the state, with a severe disparity of incomes between the wealthy and poor. There was a man, named Oscar, who had a modest occupation, many children, and as a result, financial challenges. He lived in a rental house that was not very large, drove an older vehicle, and lived economically. Oscar’s youngest son struggled with a series of medical issues that caused additional strain on the family’s resources. I visited with Oscar’s family on several occasions. He always made a point to say, “Offer a prayer of thanks to God because we are so very blessed.” Then he would go on to point out the abundance in which he lived – having had a delicious meal lovingly prepared by his oldest daughter, a padded chair that was so very welcoming in the evening, another son who was doing well in school. Oscar always had a list of things to recount his prosperity and wealth. This sense of abundance flowed from the peace he had from Christ.

I am sure that some days Oscar worried, but I suspect his worry was less severe and shorter lived because of his sense of Jesus’ peace. For Oscar, the peace of Christ was a constant presence that filled his days and perceptions. This same peace is constantly being offered to us, as well. The word we translate “peace” εἰρήνη, {i-ray'-nay} includes the meaning of tranquility and prosperity. The point, though, is that prosperity doesn’t necessarily mean wealth or luxury, but above all refers to abundance of blessing. Sadly, many look past their abundance of blessing to focus upon their particular “wants” or envy. They cannot experience the joy of peace because of their own anxiousness. It is Jesus’ intention and desire to share freedom from fear, with us. We are being offered a state of calm, joy, and bliss as we navigate through the challenges that will come to every life.

Our challenge is to choose Jesus’ peace over our own worry and fear. Jesus is offering us a fellowship with God that grows through our dwelling with Jesus. It is a process of filling our minds and hearts with the knowledge of Jesus’ love, so that we can live in that peace.

Coming Up in Worship

03/15/2020 Third Sunday of Lent

Sermon: "Our Continued Struggle"

Theme: We are made strong to overcome our challenges of superficiality and selfishness through drawing from God's grace and sustaining love.

Purpose: We will examine ways to remain strong in our path of growth and transformation.

Scriptures: Exodus 17:1-7 The people of Israel quarrel with Moses and complain that they do not have water.

Romans 5:1-11 We are justified through faith, God's love is proved to us that while we were sinners Christ died.

Questions:

What are we making harder in our relationships than really needs to be? In what ways are we caught up in our emotional and personal issues? How is it our ego is causing us to live a less fulfilling and joyful life? In what ways do the experiences and challenges we experience enable us to know God more fully? How do we move from being resistant to seeing God in our hard times to becoming people who become closer to God through our difficult times?

03/22/2020 Fourth Sunday of Lent, Leisa Wagstaff from South Sudan.

Sermon: "Choosing the Light"

Theme: We choose to listen to God's direction and gifts rather than return to our need for control or comfort.

Purpose: The congregation will renew their commitment to listening to God's call upon their lives.

Scriptures: Ephesians 5:8-14 Be people of the light, take no part in the works of darkness.
John 9:1-41 Jesus heals a man born blind, the conflict with the Pharisees who cannot accept the healing.

Questions:

What is blinding us from seeing the possibilities of God's presence and power in the world around us? In what ways do we miss God's grace and power because of our perceptions and judgments? How do we release our need for control and our false over confidence in order to see God's movement in the world around us? What do we need to do in order to be part of God's light coming into the world, rather than to be locked in our own limited points of view?

03/29/2020 Fifth Sunday of Lent

Sermon: "Revived When Hope is Lost"

Theme: God restores our strength if we will wait upon Jesus' love and compassion for us.

Purpose: We will draw strength from listening to God's direction and presence.

Scriptures: Ezekiel 37:1-14 The valley of dry bones, Ezekiel's promise that God will raise again those who were in despair.

John 11:1-45 The raising of Lazarus, the brother of Mary and Martha, from the dead.

Questions:

In what ways does our faith and relationship with God need to be "raised from the dead?" How is it we have given up expectation that God can do something different in our lives? What is necessary so that we can be people who see Jesus' deep love and care for us even though circumstances are not going as we would hope? How do we live faithfully when we do not see how God's promises might be fulfilled? What is our role in being the ones to whom Jesus is coming to do a miracle? How do we live as people who expect God to act rather than to be overwhelmed by our fears and despair?

A Word Concerning the Coronavirus



Some questions have been raised regarding the Coronavirus and any impact this will have on our fellowship together. First, and most importantly, those most vulnerable to the illness are those over the age of 60, particularly those who have respiratory difficulties. We need to be mindful of members of the congregation who may be vulnerable, and practice good community, to be aware of those in need of support and to provide assistance, as necessary. There are indicators that, in the locations, where neighbors supported and looked out for one another the impact was less severe.

Changes in worship schedule and cancellations will be handled in the same way we would handle a snowstorm or other weather-related issue. Check our website, KFIZ radio or Channel 5 (WFRV Green Bay) for closings. If school is suspended, we will consider closing, depending on instructions from local health officials. In the case that we are forced to reduce activities we will increase the number of podcasts and programs available through our website:

If you have a cough or cold symptoms, please stay home. Be mindful of not spreading the infection. For those who get sick, a small number will experience significant illness, for most, it will be similar to the flu, or even less severe. Wash your hands frequently and thoroughly with soap and warm water. Reduce physical contact and be aware that many people are avoiding handshakes, hugs and other contact – be respectful of their wishes.

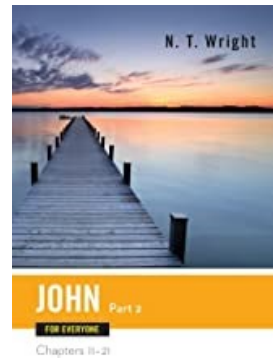

Embracing the Uncertain: A Lenten Study for Unsteady Times

Just turning on the news lets us know we are living in uncertain times. Economic instabilities, eruptions of violence, and natural catastrophes can alter the lives and landscapes of entire communities. Our individual lives are often just as unsteady: relationships can break, plans can falter, and confidence can fail.

Uncertainty can definitely be uncomfortable. Many of us prefer stability and a predictable future to an unknown fate. We are wired to want to control our destiny.

The reality is that in our fast-changing, unpredictable world there are few guarantees in life. It's those who are willing to embrace uncertainty and make the risky decision to follow Jesus despite the many "unknowns" who will reap the greatest rewards.

During Lent we will engage and wrestle with life's uncertainties, not ignore them. The first six chapters focus on six post-Transfiguration, pre-Passion stories in the Gospels. Each of these stories are signposts in the gospel narrative, pointing down at a world filled with uncertainty, but pointing us forward to a cross that can show us how to follow Jesus with courage, hope and obedience.
