
This workshop will help you understand . . .

About the Workshop:

Conflict is a normal part of life, even in the church. Understanding this can help church members realize that they should not be surprised or ashamed when they experience conflict in their faith communities. What is important is how the conflicts that inevitably arise are dealt with. The *Conflict in the Church: Entrusted with the Message of Reconciliation* workshop teaches some basic skills that will help participants manage conflicts within the congregation in a healthier manner.


